Change Log

A newly added feature is the Change Log. You do need to be logged into the Administration Login area to view it, but there are many things that you can learn. Database Updates will display when you did the last full update, from what database, what the program version was and what PDFs were used. You will also see when your last sales update was performed. If we host the maps, it will also show you the last time they were updated. There is also the Website Updates tab, which will show you the enhancements that are being made to your website and when they were done.

Lastly, another cool feature recently added was the auto-fill of the street name. The user simply needs to type at least 3 letters of the street name, and it will come up with a list of possible names for that area. The user can still override it by just pressing the Enter key, but now there is a unique list of possible street names for each county website.




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The Display Order in Sketch

Today, I am going to write about a feature of Sketch called the Display Order. This is the order sketch objects are stacked on top of each and determines the order in which they are drawn. By manipulating this stacking order, it is possible to produce some interesting effects.

For this example, I'll demonstrate how to stack objects and apply a fill pattern to one –without obscuring the label text of either object. For clarity, my first image shows the labels outside the object. The second image shows the labels inside, and the final image shows how I want the finished drawing to appear. Because I want the labels to be inside shaded objects, yet still be readable, we'll have to take into consideration the Display Order in which the objects are drawn.




An easy way to think about the Display Order is when objects are drawn, they get added to the **end** of the Display Order list. Hence, the first item drawn is at the top of the list, the second object is below the first, the third is below that and so forth. Objects higher in the list can be made to overlap and obscure objects lower in the list, because by definition, they are drawn before the lower objects.

In my example, the typical drawing procedure is to first draw the 1-story frame addition, and then draw the smaller, open-porch addition. Therefore, the object higher on the list (i.e., the 1-story addition) could obscure the open-porch, which is lower in the list.



If I enable a fill pattern on the 1-story addition without changing the display order, I get a result that obscures the label of the open-porch. We can make this better by changing the display order these two objects.

First make sure the transparency of the label text is **disabled** for both objects. Change it (if necessary) via the Object Name Properties box.

Next open the Display Order box by pressing <F6> or from the **Edit > “Display Order...”** menu.





The Display Order in Sketch-Continued

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With the Display Order dialog open, notice the open-porch is **lower** in the display order than the 1-story frame addition. The user can now manipulate the order by selecting an object and pressing the respective Move Up or Move Down buttons, or by using drag-n-drop with the mouse.

After changing the order and pressing OK, the sketch will refresh. As you can see, the Sketch makes it pretty easy to change the display order of objects. Some users who know about the Display Order may simply want to use the quick shortcut menus to move objects all the way to the top or to the bottom of the Display Order.





That you can view parcel count information with 2 clicks of the mouse?



You may have never noticed the handy Utility located under the Tools button within CAMAvision®. This tool gives you a snap shot of your data, Parcel Counts Info and Statistics of many areas of the system.

You will see the number of parcels for many different parts of CAMAvision®. This can be used as an audit tool to find discrepancies in your data or to verify the info being stored in your system. For example, (for Iowa Clients) if you know you have 600 parcels with exemptions in your Tax Administration System, you could use this tool to verify you have exemptions on 600 parcels in CAMAvision® as well. If your IT staff is asking about the size of your CAMA database you can use this utility to explain that you have 49,406 photos in your system which may take up a sizable amount of server space. Overall, it's just good information to have at your figure tips.



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
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PhotoVision® on your tablet


When training on tablets and Remote, I've had several questions regarding taking photos with my tablet and having those photos import directly into CAMAvision®. This may be a little hard to describe in a Newsletter article, but I'll give it a shot.

The first step is to make sure your settings on the **MAIN SYSTEM** are set as shown below:



Go to the PhotoVision section of your Preferences, and then click the check box for the Monitor Camera Roll Folder. This should be done for each user who will be using a tablet, as it is not a system-wide setting.

After checking your parcels out onto a tablet, Load a parcel and **OPEN** PhotoVision.

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The Next step is to use the camera app on your Windows 8 tablet. To do so, drag from the left with your finger or stylus to activate the Windows 8 menu tool bar.



Then tap on the start button.

Next find the camera app icon, it may be hard to find at first but should look something like this.



Tap on that icon. This will activate the tablet's camera. **Keep in mind that cameras on tablets usually don't have the same quality as most of your digital cameras.**

After activating the camera, you may have to use the settings to switch from the forward "selfie" view to the camera on the back, because NO ONE wants to see THIS in PhotoVision!



After taking your photo, swipe from the left of tablet screen to the right, bringing CAMAvision to the front. Your newly taken photo will have automatically dropped into PhotoVision.

If you Swipe less than half way across your screen you will get the "split screen" effect, showing both CAMAvision and the Camera. You'll have to get used to your tablet. I know my tablet and my Windows 8 laptop have much different sensitivity when it comes to the split screen. Have fun, and let us know if you have any questions. Also, feel free to bring your tablet to any conference or User Group Meeting to have us help you with these settings.
